6. What supplementary materials are available with this textbook? What are the strengths of these supplementary materials?

Amplify CKLA 3rd Edition offers a wide range of supplementary materials for both students and teachers. For students, the program includes decodable readers in grades K–2, which help early readers apply phonics skills in context and build foundational literacy. In grades 3–5, students engage with a curated selection of student readers and novels, blending classic and contemporary literature to support knowledge-building and critical thinking. The Poet's Journal encourages creativity and exploration of poetic forms, while eReaders and digital tools increase accessibility and enhance engagement. Students also benefit from skill-building practice games, which use gamified activities to reinforce key literacy concepts in a fun, interactive way.
